- IV. Art and Architecture
 - A. Challenged conventional rules
 - B. Realism is not important (What is real?) impact of the camera
 - C. Artist's imagination, feelings, experiences and dreams now focus
 - D. New conception of reality

E. Architecture - moves from traditional ideas; structures blend into the environment - "form follows function"

V. Music

- A. Jazz blend of African and "traditional" music
- B. Highly improvisational dependent on what the artist wants to play

VI. Post-war youth

- A. Rejected the morals and values of the older generations
- B. Death = war -- live for the moment/now

VII. Emancipation of Women

- A. Relative improvements "labor saving devices", work outside of the home, some political activity, pink ghettos
